Review: **Present Continuous and Simple Present**

The Simple Present describes habits –things that we do again and again – and routines and schedules – things you do regularly.

Eg.: Mike **works** for an advertising company.

I **do** a lot of sports.

The bus **comes** at 8 o'clock every day.

Remember:

I	}	verb	I play volleyball.
You			You watch TV at night.
We			We speak Portuguese.
They			They live in Rio de Janeiro.

He	}	verb + s	He plays soccer.
She			She watches TV at night.
It			It lives in Rio de Janeiro.

Attention:

- verbs ending in **-o, -s, -ss, -sh, -ch, -x, or -z + es**

I go – she goes You brush – she brushes They fix – he fixes

- verbs ending in **-y, preceded by a consonant**, you **cross out the -y** and add **-ies**.

I study – he studies You try – she tries

Negative and Interrogative forms:

I	}	do not speak French.

They		do n't

He	}	does not drive.
She		
It		doe sn't

We can use words like **always, usually, often, sometimes, never, every** with the Simple Present.

Eg.: I **always** go to the beach on the weekend.

You **usually** take the 7 o'clock bus.

He **often** drives to work.

She **sometimes** works on Saturdays.

We **never** take tests on Sundays.

They go to school **every** day.

Do you remember the Present Continuous?

The Present Continuous is used to talk about things that are happening now.

Eg.: Ana is busy. She **is speaking** on the phone.
Look! The bus **is coming**.

Remember:

BE VERB + ING

Negative and Interrogative forms:

I am not sleeping now.

Am I doing the right thing?

You }
We } are not working now.
They }

Are { you
we } taking the right train?
they }

He }
She } is not studying now.
It }

Is { he
she } drinking water?
it }

Pay attention!!!!!!!!!!

I **leave** home at 7 o'clock **every** morning.

I **am leaving** home **now**.
